This past year, the Marching Lancer Band & Colorguard were proud to represent New England in the 2011 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, CA. A total of 311 performers, plus a complement of 40 staff and chaperones, departed on December 28 for the six-day trip. While in California, the Lancers performed at Disneyland and also presented their field show at Pasadena City College. They also performed on the ice for the LA Kings Hockey Team at the Staples Center, making NHL history by doing so. But the culminating activity was on New Year's Day when the Lancers marched in the 122nd Rose Parade. Before a crowd of one million along the parade route, the Lancers marched 5.5 miles in 2.5 hours. The Rose Parade was also televised to a national audience of 60 million. It was also broadcasted in 215 countries, including all Provinces of China, for an additional 1.5 billion viewers. This was the 4th appearance of the Lancers in the Rose Parade, with others occurring in 1992, 1997 and 2004.

In March, the Lancers performed in the 250th New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade, the oldest parade in America. The night before the parade the students visited Times Square and attended a production of "The Lion King" on Broadway. The Lancers also took first-place in the NYC St. Patrick's Parade.

The LHS Jazz Ensemble was also busy in March, participating in the UNH Jazz Festival, as well as the Berklee Jazz Festival in Boston, receiving "honorable mention" at both locations.

The program was designed to identify those skills that youngsters needed to enter the least restrictive school placement and to systematically target and teach those behaviors using peer models.

The LEEP program has been recognized as one of the model preschool special education programs in the State.
