

LONDONDERRY HIGH SCHOOL/FRANKLIN PIERCE UNIVERSITY ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Program

Londonderry High School (LHS) and Franklin Pierce University (FPU) have created a program to successfully transition LHS seniors to college at FPU. The partnership began in the 2006-2007 academic year. The articulation program seeks to encourage all LHS students to consider post-secondary options and to make Londonderry course selection more purposeful for students. LHS courses, cumulative grade point averages, and the successful completion of a FPU application are all integral components where LHS students benefit from the following:

- 1) Non-binding acceptance to FPU that allows LHS seniors to continue to research other colleges and universities
- 2) Scholarships up to \$ 17,000 a year, based upon the students high school cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA), class rank, and SAT/ACT at the conclusion of the first semester of senior year
- 3) Eligibility to enroll in any FPU major, including Undecided

Admission Decisions

FPU offers nearly 50 different academic programs (majors, minors, concentrations and/or certificates) in the fields of Accounting, Acting/Directing, Advertising, American studies, Anthropology/Archaeology, Applied Economics, Art/Fine Arts, Arts Management, Biology, Business Administration, Chemistry, Computer Information Technology, Computer Applications, Creative Writing, Criminal Justice, Dance, Education-Elementary, Education-Secondary, Education-Art, English, Environmental Science, Environmental Studies, Finance, Global Citizenship, Graphic Communications, History, International Management, Journalism, Management, Marketing, Mass Communication, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Pre-Law, Pre-Med, Pre-Physical Therapy, Psychology, Radio Broadcasting, Social Work and Counseling, Sociology, Spanish, Sports and Recreation Management, student Designed Major, Technical Theatre/Design, Television Broadcasting, Undecided, and Women in Leadership. Admissions is based on Rolling Enrollment, apply at any time with no deadline.

Recommended High School Courses

LHS students are encouraged to take the most challenging level of core courses that they can successfully complete. Core courses include English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. If students are focused on a specific career, they should explore mass communication, music, graphic arts, theatre, criminal justice and sports journalism courses here at LHS in addition to core courses.

Scholarships

FPU offers scholarships to students who follow the enrollment guidelines through the LHS/FPU articulation agreement, as per the 2011-2012 recruitment schedule:

Those students meeting these guidelines will qualify for scholarship money. LHS students are awarded scholarships based upon their cumulative grade point average (GPA). The deadline for reaching the minimum GPA is at the conclusion of the first semester of the senior year.

Articulation scholarships for the 2011-2012 academic year:

Although the student's grade point average (GPA) is the primary factor in considering scholarships, strength of academic program, class rank and SAT/ACT scores are also considered in the final evaluation.
