APPLICATION FOR PARKING PERMIT
2009-2010
GENERAL INFORMATION

Any student applying for a parking permit should read the Student Parking Policy (see below). Only students who plan to drive to school on a regular basis should apply for a parking permit. Any student who obtains a parking permit must hold a valid driver's license and be able to provide proof of insurance and registration information.

Students must apply for a parking permit on an annual basis. Any student applying for a parking permit for the 2009-2010 school year must complete the application available in House 1. Parking permits will be issued based upon the point system as outlined on the application and in the Student Handbook.

- Students are asked to complete the top sections of the application only! Do not complete the bottom section of the application—testing information and total points will be completed by the Assistant Principal. If you need an application, please stop by House 1 or email pdupton@londonderry.org
- Please return the completed form to House 1. **The parking permit deadline for the 09-10 school year has passed, so your application will be placed on the waiting list.**
- While we wish we could provide every student a permit, there is only a limited amount of parking spots available at LHS. We will keep all applications on file and those students not receiving a permit will automatically be placed on a wait list based upon class year, points and date of return of the parking application.

Student Parking Policy

The parking of vehicles, including motorcycles, by students on school district property during the school day shall be considered to be a privilege. All such vehicles shall be registered through the school office, shall have a valid parking permit prominently displayed on the vehicle and shall be parked in student designated parking areas only. Motorcycle drivers and riders, regardless of age, are required to wear a helmet while riding on school district property.

The parking of student vehicles in non-designated areas such as fire safety lanes, delivery ways, the lawns or grass, restricted areas and other non-designated areas; or failure to comply with the rules of normal driver courtesy including speeding and endangering the safety of others; or loitering in vehicles or in a parking area shall lead to revocation of this privilege.

- Students must apply for parking privileges on an annual basis.
- Student parking privileges are not transferable to another student except for short term emergency situations approved by the Principal.
- The team of Assistant Principals will meet to make a decision regarding permits for any student with a discipline history that includes repeated class cuts, truancy, and/or out-of-school suspensions.
- Students who are granted a parking permit will receive normal consequences for their first class cut or truancy, but will lose their parking permit for the remainder of the school year if there is a second offense.
- Students who can't make it to school on time will lose their parking permit after 6 unexcused tardies to school.
- In no case may a student, regardless of age, drive to or from field trips, athletic contests, or other activities for which transportation is arranged by the school or school organization. This includes the use of student drivers for "errands" for the school or school personnel.

Medical Issues: Any student who is issued a handicap permit (temporary or permanent) by the State of NH based on the recommendation of a doctor will automatically be granted a Londonderry High School parking permit upon providing appropriate documentation.
