

## LONDONDERRY HIGH SCHOOL/PLYMOUTH STATE UNIVERSITY ARTICULATION AGREEMENT-2011-2012

### Program

Londonderry High School (LHS) and Plymouth State University (PSU) have a pact that allows LHS seniors to thoroughly explore all of the excellent programs and majors that PSU offers. LHS and parents will be given comprehensive information on Plymouth State University. Upon acceptance, qualified LHS seniors will be awarded PSU scholarships. **Nursing Program approved by USNH Board of Trustees. About 40 percent of our students are not New Hampshire residents**

### Merit Scholarships

Freshmen scholarships, based upon merit, will be available to certain LHS students based upon academic performance. These scholarships are based upon LHS students placing in the top 15% of their class and having standardized test scores in Critical Reading and Math that exceed 1000 combined. These scholarships are renewable for the entire four years at PSU, based upon the LHS student remaining in "good standing" at PSU. 20 students from the Londonderry High School Class of 2011 are attending PSU but none were eligible for the Plymouth State scholarships.

### Timeline

Plymouth State University accepts all applications on a 'rolling' basis. There is no specific deadline but LHS seniors are encouraged to apply earlier than later in the school year. Due to the popularity of the institution, Londonderry high School has no plans to offer a formal campus trip to PSU in 2011-2012

### **Common Application Instructions & Requirements**

Go to [Common Application](#) to complete the Common Application and the PSU Supplement. PSU encourages that all application materials be received online.

- PSU's supplement and application fee need to be submitted at the same time as the online Common Application.
- For those who have been out of school for a few years or are non-traditional, you may prefer to download the application from the [Common Application Web site](#), complete it and submit it by mail. PSU's [Common Application Supplement](#), [Application Fee form](#), and fee must also be submitted by mail.
- Please do not mix and match your application, supplement, and payment between online and paper submission by mail.
- PSU recommends making a copy of your completed application to keep for your files.

2. Official copies of all transcripts with a minimum of first quarter grades, or GED (be sure to include your six-digit high school CEEB code number; ask your guidance counselor if you are unsure.)
3. A well-written essay on one of the subjects listed on the application
4. Payment of the application fee (\$50)
5. One academic recommendation
6. Testing scores (SAT or ACT with Writing Section)\*
