

Londonderry High School/Suffolk University Articulation Agreement- 2011-2012

Program

Londonderry High School (LHS) and Suffolk University have built a bridge to allow LHS graduates to attend Suffolk. In addition, the articulation program seeks to encourage all LHS students to consider post-secondary options, and to make Londonderry course selection more purposeful for students. LHS courses, their cumulative grade point averages and the successful compilation of Suffolk application materials are an integral process by which LHS students may benefit from the following:

- 1) Non-binding acceptance to SU that allows LHS seniors to continue to research other colleges and universities
- 2) Scholarships up to \$13,000/year based upon the students high school GPA at the conclusion of first semester, senior year
- 3) Eligibility to enroll in any Suffolk university major (including undeclared)
- 4) Choice between commuting or residing on campus

Admission Decisions

Suffolk offers over 70 academic programs in the fields of Business, Liberal Arts, Science and Engineering. Suffolk offers programs in both Boston, MA and Madrid Spain. LHS students may apply for any of the degree programs offered at Suffolk through the articulation agreement. The articulation agreement deadline is January 1st. For students interested in applying Early Action, the deadline is November 15th.

Recommended High School Courses

LHS students are encouraged to take the most challenging level of core courses that they can be successful in. Core courses include English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Students must complete 16 core classes in English, History, Math, Science and Foreign Language.

Applications and Forms

First-year students are encouraged to apply online. Although applying online does help to expedite the overall application process, equal consideration is given to those applicants who apply by mail.

Online

Along with recommendations and SAT scores and high school transcript, first-year students are required to submit:

Financial Aid Supplements:

You should apply for financial aid at the same time you apply for admission. Don't wait until you have admitted to a program to apply. The FAFSA and Suffolk University Financial Aid application can be filed anytime after January 1 of the following academic year. Suffolk University Financial Aid Applications are due:

- February 15 for New Freshman

Free Application for Federal Student Aid(FAFSA) - recommended filing date by February 15.

The Federal Code for Suffolk University is 002218.

Students are not required to submit tax returns unless their application is selected by the U.S. Department of Education or Suffolk University for verification. Refer to the Student Aid Report for selection determination.

Scholarships

Suffolk offers scholarships to LHS students who meet the January 1, 2012 deadline qualify for scholarships based upon their seven semester weighted cumulative grade point averages at Londonderry High School.

Those students following these guidelines and procedures will qualify for scholarship money. LHS students are awarded scholarships based on their cumulative grade point average (GPA). The deadline for reaching the minimum GPA requirements is at the conclusion of the first semester of senior year. Suffolk University is a Common Application School.

Scholarships offered to students whose GPA ranges between 3.35 and 4.0 are renewable if the student maintains a cumulative 3.0 GPA while at Suffolk. The scholarships will be awarded during the financial aid award process in the spring of the student's senior year. 3 members of the Class of 2011 earned \$23,000 in 2011-2012 for a four year yield of \$92,000.

3.7+	10%	1250	\$13,000
3.5+	15%	1100	\$10,000
3.35+	25%	1050	\$7,000

*** These students are eligible to compete for half tuition scholarships in the University Honors program (Honors award would supersede the original scholarship award). Information about the honors program is available in the high school guidance office.**
